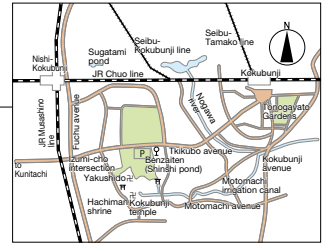


# Musashikokubunji Park

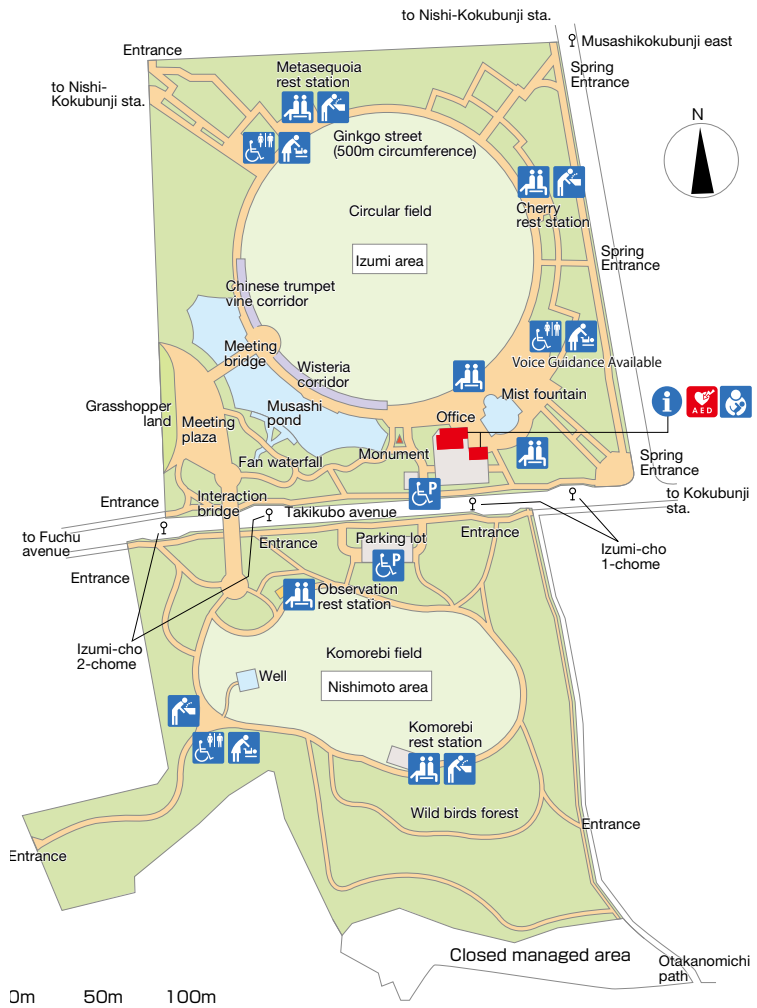
- Location Izumi-cho 2-chome, Nishi-Motomachi 1/2-chome, Kokubunji City

This park was made by remodeling the sites of Central Railway School of former Japanese National Railways and the location of detached houses of the Ministry of Posts and Telecommunications. On the west side of the park is the site of Tosando Musashi-michi Highway and on the south of Kokubunji cliff range is the "Otaka road" and "Masugata pond," connecting further to the site of the ancient Musashi Kokubunji Temple. The spring water around the area is selected as one of the Selected 100 Exquisite and Well-Conserved Waters of Japan.

The park is divided across the metropolitan road into the northern Izumi area and the southern Nishimoto area. Izumi district has a 500 meters circumference circular field, Musashi pond, and fog fountain and is used for walking exercises. You can feel the nature of Musashino by visiting the Komorebi field and the wild bird forest surrounded by trees in the Nishimoto district with its hilly terrain.

The park is an all-purpose park which considers the harmony of the natural environment and the cultural and historical heritage as well as provides disaster prevention functions with its safety evacuation area during times of emergencies.
