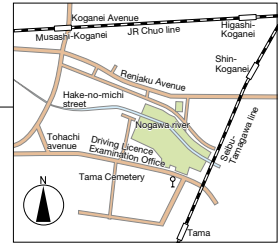


## Musashino Park

- Transport Musashino-Koen bus stop on Keio bus for south exit of Musashi-Koganei from north exit of Chofu (Keio line).  
3-minute walk from Tama-cho bus stop on Keio Bus for Tama-Reien/Tama-cho from south exit of Musashi-Koganei (JR Chuo line).  
Musashino-Koen bus stop on Keio Bus for north exit of Chofu from south exit of Musashi-Koganei (JR Chuo line).  
Tama-cho 2-chome bus stop on Odakyu Bus for Mitaka from south exit of Musashi-Koganei (JR Chuo line).  
20-minute-walk from SHINKOGANEI Station (Seibu Tamagawa Line).  
Paid parking available 24 hours.



Beautiful park with fields and woods along Nogawa River. There are various activities you can enjoy at different parts of the park, including Barbecue field, Sprashing Pond, and baseball field.

From early to late April, 600 cherry trees (Someiyoshino and Satozakura) blossom one after another.

### Nursery

As a green supply source, our nursery garden provides trees to parks

and streets.

We grow 2800 roots of 90 different kinds of trees including zelkova and Chimonanthus praecox. The nursery garden is also a place to do research and experiments for tree growth.

### Kujirayama Hill

A small hill in one area of the park. The name comes from its shape that looks like the top part of a whale. From its peak, you can see Kokubunji Cliff Line (also called hake) along the Nogawa River. A vast field spreads across the northern part and is open to the public as Openfield (Harappa).

Opened / August 1, 1964 Area / 255,864.29 m<sup>2</sup> (Interest free loan for government-owned lands is provided to parts of the garden.)

Trees / Tall trees: 4,700, Shrubs: 4,800 m<sup>2</sup> + 6,900

Main plants: plum, zelkova, magnolia, cherry (Somei Yoshino, Yamazakura, Satozakura), Japanese cornel, trident maple, and crape myrtle.

Facilities / Baseball fields (one is normal, the other is small), barbecue field, Splashing pond
