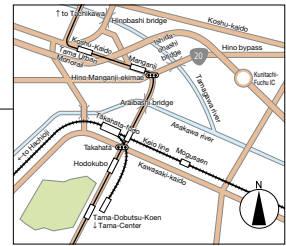


# Tama Zoological Park

Located within the Tama-kyuryo Natural Park, Tama Zoo spans an area about four times that of Ueno Zoological Gardens. There are minimal fences and cages and breeds and exhibits the animals in a large environment for them to roam free so that you can see the natural behaviors of them. The zoo is separated into an Asiatic Garden, Australian Garden, African Garden and the insectarium, exhibiting the animals by the regions of their natural habitats. Many wild birds and insects also live in this park with mixed forests of jolcham oak and sawtooth oak.

## Asian Garden

At the orangutan skywalk, you can view orangutans cross the wire ropes on about 15-meter high tower and about 150 meters apart. Przewalski's horses and gray wolves living in herds can be seen right next to each other in the pastures where they can roam free at the "Asia no heigen (Plain in Asia)." Snow leopards and Indian rhinoceros are also exhibited in the area. Asian elephant house is built to take care of them in their herds.

## African Garden

Various artifices were employed to create an environment that remembers the feel of the vast African landscape. This area holds the lion garden, chimpanzee forest, and African elephant range, as well as a savanna where giraffes, pelicans, and other animals

live together. However, Lion bus station hut and the Savannah is under construction due to deterioration. The Lion bus is also not in service.

## Australian Garden

Since June 2016, we have started exhibiting the Tasmanian Devil that originated from Tasmania, Australia. We were permitted to join the program to raise public awareness of Tasmanian Devils by breeding them as one of the conservation activities for the Tasmania government. Two Tasmanian Devils have joined our zoo, and we have become the only zoo in Asia to breed Tasmanian Devils.

## Insectarium

The insectarium is made of a large greenhouse that you can walk-through, and visitors can observe the butterflies closely throughout the year. In the main building of the insectarium, there are exhibits of domestic aquatic insects, foreign leafcutter ant, and glow worms as well as insect specimens and models and a petting corner where you can touch and observe the insects.

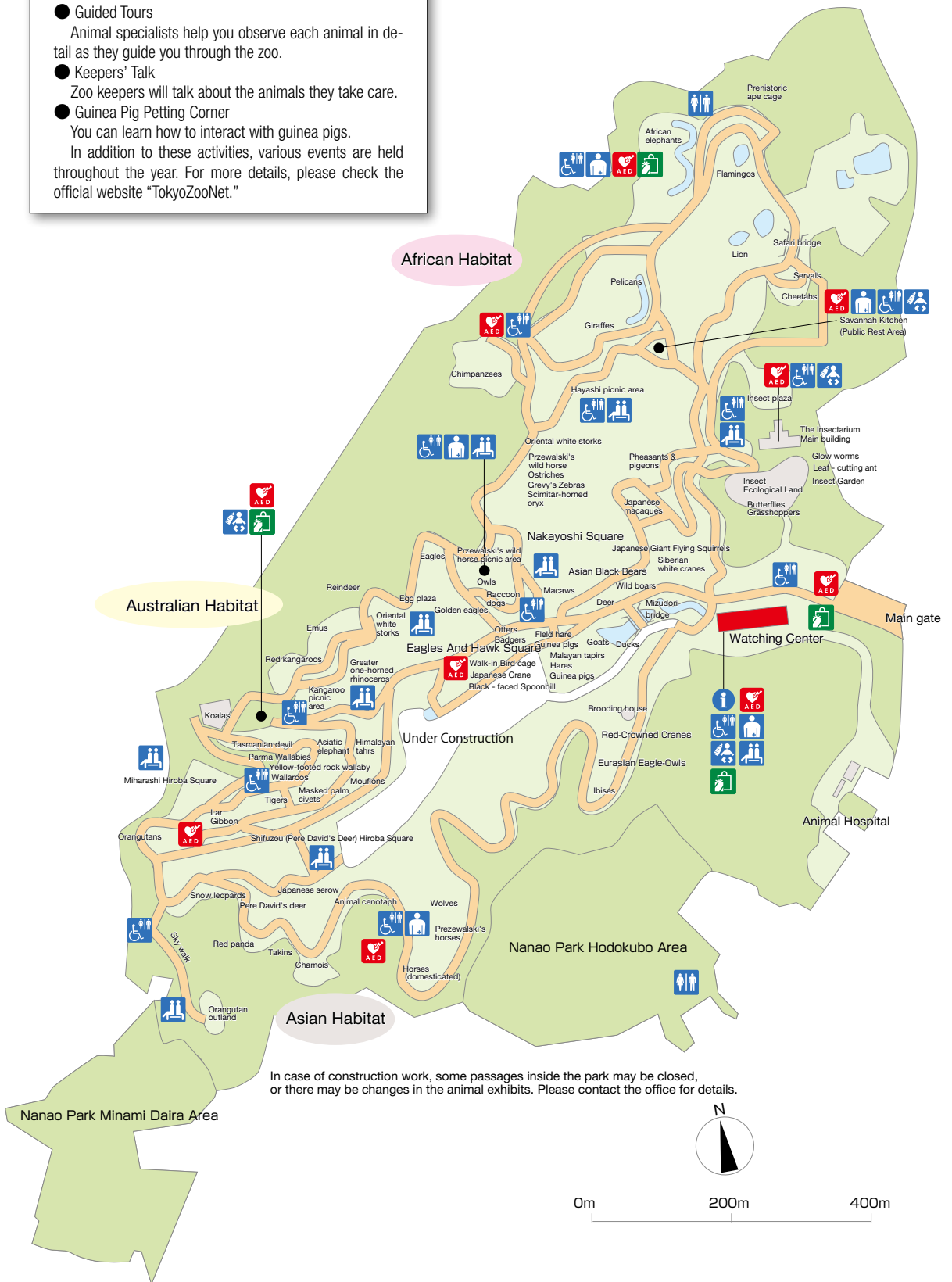
